Message from Pastor Frank

To date, I have written over 35 Pastor's Pages sharing my thoughts and reflections on the meaning of Easter and how that should influence our lives as a resurrection community.

It has always been a challenge to communicate an Easter message each year that cannot be compromised or embellished with exaggeration in an effort to add something new to a story that does not need any of my glittering generalities, or attempts to give the message a new meaning with contemporary application.

<u>Easter is His story</u> and His invitation to experience life as it was meant to be, life beyond life, a life full of hope and promise that in the end, God will always have the last word and death is no more because **He has risen**, **He has risen indeed**. And because He is risen, so shall we!

We are all moving non-stop through various stages in our lives; we are just not sure we know where we are and where we're going. **Easter is a signpost** inviting us to get our bearings and travel a new way to a new place to live a new kind of life. These are moments in time; passages that we cannot ignore. And each of these stages must be guided by the hope that is ours in Jesus Christ.

Today I write my first Easter letter as an Interim Pastor (Partially retired!) while still trying to pull away from having failed at retirement and embracing this stage of my own life! This is really bittersweet! It is bitter because I have moved away from the joys, challenges, and at times discouragements full time ministry affords, to embrace the discipline of setting boundaries in terms of time commitment and the unexpected needs that arise and cannot be ignored as an Interim.

Sweet, because I believe I have spread out before me an opportunity to use my identity, gifts, and call in a new way that will hopefully shape an adventure that

will allow me to continue my call. I cannot forget, and neither can you, that we have been called for life.

So, having said this, I am asking you to set aside some time for us to share, as a community, in the services and events we have prepared for this Easter celebration. Consider Maundy Thursday service; it has always been a special service for me because of its simplicity and intimacy. It will be our time to break bread and drink from the cup as our Lord so commanded as a part of common-unity in our ministry

Consider also; Good Friday service: I see this as an awe-inspiring service. Seven members of the church will reflect on each of the seven last words of Christ on the Cross: we will sing a verse of different hymns in between each reflection, and have introspective prayer. **And then comes Sunday!** Of all the worship experiences I have ever participated in, this is my summit experience. I pray it will be yours.

This is the one celebration with which the secular society, the malls, and Easter bunny cannot compete. It is here that God reaches out to the believer, the seeker, and yes, even the skeptic with an unconditional love that invites all to celebrate what He has done for us in life, through suffering, and finally in His glorious Resurrection.

I feel abundantly blessed, humbly honored, and sincerely grateful to be a part of our Easter celebration this year and will cherish every moment. Our time together, though seemingly short in tenure has, nevertheless, drawn many of us closer as pastor and people.

Already we have walked together through times of joy and times of grief; we shared our heartfelt desires and hopes that God will honor our community of faith with growth and a viable witness (Baptist witness) in Grafton. You may say that I'm a dreamer, but I still hold on to the belief that if only by the Grace of God, the best is ahead for BCG.

In essence, I want to say thank you, thank you so much for living the Gospel in word and in deed. And let's work together to set the foundation for a future ministry in Grafton as we walk together, worships together and prayer together in the months ahead for guidance and discernment.

But for now, I want to leave you with these words from Phillip Yancey:

"I take hope in Jesus' scars. From the perspective of heaven, they represent the most horrible event that has ever happened in the history of the universe - the crucifixion - Easter turned into a memory. Because of Easter, I can hope that the tears we shed, the blows we receive, the emotional pain, the heartache over lost friends and loved ones, all these will become memories, like Jesus' scars. Scars

never completely go away, but neither do they hurt any longer. We will have recreated bodies, a re-created heaven and earth. We will have a new start, an Easter start."

The April prayer for the search for a new Pastor


